Martyn Lloyd Jones: "There is nothing more tragic than the failure on the part of many professing Christians to realize the uniqueness and special character of a Christian. He or she is a man or woman who can never be explained in natural terms. The very essence of the Christian's position is that of an enigma (it's puzzling). There is something unusual, something inexplicable and something elusive about him or her from the standpoint of the natural man. He or she is something quite distinct and apart.

A. A Christian is special because we are ______ than those who aren't Christian.

- The Christian goes the extra mile and turns the other cheek.
- The Christian will do the extra thing at the company party, or will love the unlovely in school or in the work place.

- A Christian can go beyond the highest moral standard and affect the lives of others around them with the love of Christ.

A. Going the ______ – there is a characteristic that says we go beyond the norm. Matthew 5:38–42 (NIV)

³⁸ "You have heard that it was said, 'Eye for eye, and tooth for tooth.' ³⁹ But I tell you, do not resist an evil person. If anyone slaps you on the right cheek, turn to them the other cheek also. ⁴⁰ And if anyone wants to sue you and take your shirt, hand over your coat as well. ⁴¹ If anyone forces you to go one mile, go with them two miles. ⁴² Give to the one who asks you, and do not turn away from the one who wants to borrow from you.

B. Sacrificing _____

1 Corinthians 8:4-13

4 So then, about eating food sacrificed to idols: We know that an idol is nothing at all in the world and that there is no God but one. 5 For even if there are so-called gods, whether in heaven or on earth (as indeed there are many "gods" and many "lords"), 6 yet for us there is but one God, the Father, from whom all things came and for whom we live; and there is but one Lord, Jesus Christ, through whom all things came and through whom we live.

7 But not everyone knows this. Some people are still so accustomed to idols that when they eat such food they think of it as having been sacrificed to an idol, and since their conscience is weak, it is defiled. 8 But food does not bring us near to God; we are no worse if we do not eat, and no better if we do.

9 Be careful, however, that the exercise of your freedom does not become a stumbling block to the weak. 10 For if anyone with a weak conscience sees you who have this knowledge eating in an idol's temple, won't he be emboldened to eat what has been sacrificed to idols? 11 So this weak brother, for whom Christ died, is destroyed by your knowledge. 12 When you sin against your brothers in this way and wound their weak conscience, you sin against Christ. 13 Therefore, if what I eat causes my brother to fall into sin, I will never eat meat again, so that I will not cause him to

D. Wearing a _______ John 13:2–7 (NIV)

²The evening meal was in progress, and the devil had already prompted Judas, the son of Simon Iscariot, to betray Jesus. ³Jesus knew that the Father had put all things under his power, and that he had come from God and was returning to God; ⁴so he got up from the meal, took off his outer clothing, and wrapped a towel around his waist. ⁵After that, he poured water into a basin and began to wash his disciples' feet, drying them with the towel that was wrapped around him.

⁶ He came to Simon Peter, who said to him, "Lord, are you going to wash my feet?"

⁷ Jesus replied, "You do not realize now what I am doing, but later you will understand."

¹² When he had finished washing their feet, he put on his clothes and returned to his place.
